

## in September 2025, we held our very first Global TALES Network symposium.

This event was supported through a Connection grant from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, and included 2 round-table planning days to discuss strategic directions. We decided on establishing an executive committee - EOIs invited soon!

#### The symposium was a huge success, with:

- 20 oral presentations, including 3 keynotes and panel discussions
- 10 e-posters
- 54 contributors from 12 countries
- 630 registrants, from > 35 countries
